

PIDÄ HUOLTA CONCERT!



The Western Uusimaa Police prepared to meet thousands of youth from Espoo during their concert tour. The *Pidä huolta!* concert, organized for young people, featured performances by the Helsinki Police Band. A total of four concerts took place on Tuesday, October 22, and Wednesday, October 23.

According to the press release, the events reached 3,800 young attendees. The large audience enjoyed the wind orchestra's skillful arrangements of familiar songs.

In connection with the concerts, the Western Uusimaa Police presented information sessions in Finnish and Swedish, addressing topics relevant to young people, such as bullying and violence.


Welcome to Espoo Girls' House!

Espoo Girls' House is a safe and welcoming space where you can be yourself, no matter your life situation. We value ensuring that everyone feels welcome. Here, you can relax in a respectful atmosphere—whether sitting on the couch enjoying some peace or exchanging thoughts with other girls and women, playing games, crafting, joining various groups, or having confidential conversations with an adult.

Our activities are free of charge and are not affiliated with any political or religious organizations.

On the 10th of October, when 6th 7th 8th, and 9th-grade boys spent time with a representative from Poikien Talo, a powerful seminar focused on self-empowerment, body image, support, and the power of kind words was led to same-grade girls. The event created a safe and uplifting space where the girls shared the experience, learned to embrace their unique beauty, and got to know how societal pressures affect their selfesteem. With interactive workshops and activities, they explored the importance of building each other up, practicing self-love, and using positive language to empower themselves and others. By the end of the seminar, they left with a renewed sense of confidence and unity.

Adding to the already existing antibullying measures, in the 2024/25 school year, Espoo International School initiated a new anti-bullying program aimed at primary school students (grades 1-6). The program is called EIS Crew.
