


EIS WELLBEING




WORLD PEACE GAMES

On November 12th, Espoo International School hosted a compelling presentation led by <u>Priska Kallio (os. Niemi-Sampan)</u> (M.Soc.Sc.), social psychologist and expert from <u>Someturva - SomeBuddy</u>. Priska shared critical insights on navigating the risks young people face on social media and offered valuable guidance for parents and guardians.

Here are some key takeaways:

Social Media Risks for Youth

Priska highlighted alarming statistics: 90% of young people see online bullying as a major issue, with half reporting experiences of harassment on platforms like <u>Snap Inc.</u>, <u>WhatsApp</u>, and <u>TikTok</u>. Risks include misinformation, privacy violations, sexual harassment, and even exposure to criminal activities.

Tips for Guardians

Priska provided actionable advice to help guardians support safer social media experiences for their children:

Set safety settings together to establish privacy and usage guidelines.

Encourage open discussions about online experiences and trends.

Support responsible online behavior and teach children to say "no" when necessary.

Foster empathy by reminding children there are real people behind the screen.

Build trust and offer guidance to help them navigate challenges.

Someturva – A Resource for Online Safety

Someturva offers free, multilingual support (Finnish, Swedish, English) where youth can report cyberbullying and receive quidance from trained professionals, making it a vital tool for families.

At Espoo International School, we are committed to promoting a safe, supportive environment for our students. This session underscored the importance of empathy, respect, and responsible digital citizenship. We encourage families to continue conversations about online safety at home and to reach out to school staff for support when needed.
