
FINNISH INDEPENDENCE DAY CELEBRATION AT EIS

This special assembly was a reminder of how fortunate we are to call Finland our home, a place that inspires, nurtures, and brings us together.



Exploring the Future of Wastewater Treatment! CON Wednesday, our 7th graders had the incredible opportunity to visit the state-of-the-art Blominmäki wastewater treatment plant in Espoo. The day began with an engaging lecture detailing the plant's advanced treatment processes and its pivotal role in environmental protection. Students then descended 30 meters underground to witness firsthand how Helsinki Region Environmental Services Authority (HSY) treats wastewater for over 400,000 residents across Espoo, Kauniainen, Kirkkonummi, Siuntio, and Western Vantaa.

Project News

Our students were particularly impressed by the plant's efficiency and sustainability:

High Purification Rates: The facility removes over 96% of phosphorus and organic matter, and over 90% of nitrogen from incoming wastewater.


Energy Self-Sufficiency: Remarkably, the plant generates 100% of its own heating needs and 70% of its electricity consumption through biogas produced on-site.

Significant Investment: With construction costs totaling €510 million, Blominmäki stands as HSY's largest investment to date, underscoring its commitment to cutting-edge environmental infrastructure.
